

Raising hopes for childless couples with new techniques of infertility management

New techniques in infertility management were discussed at the Advanced Infertility Management Conference held by Fortis Bloom IVF Centre in New Delhi, in association with GESI (Gynaecological Endocrine Society of India) and AOGD (Association of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists of Delhi).

The event at the centre located in Fortis La Femme Hospital was inaugurated by chief guest Mandira Bedi, in the presence of Dr Hrishikesh Pai (infertility consultant at Fortis La Femme and president of ISAR), Dr Nandita Palshetkar (secretary general, ISAR), Dr Alka Kriplani (professor and HOD, AIIMS), Dr Pratima Mittal (president, AOGD) and Dr Rishma Dhillon Pai (gynaecologist and consultant obstetrician). Mandira thanked the

infertility management experts and recalled how her family members were blessed with twins due to the contribution of experts from the IVF centre.

"Advanced treatment such as ICSI, IMSI, laser and blastocyst culture has improved the pregnancy rate in infertile couples to as much as 40-50% per attempt," said Dr Hrishikesh Pai. Keeping career-oriented women in mind, Dr Nandita Palshetkar said, "New egg freezing techniques have enabled young career-oriented unmarried women to freeze their eggs for future use."

The increase in pregnancy rates in lieu of the introduction of Advanced Reproductive Techniques were further shed light upon in the discussions headed by Dr Alka Kriplani, Dr Rishma Dhillon Pai and Dr Pratima Mittal.
